Tuesday Night Rifle League Starts Up

Our Tuesday Night rifle league begins **May 14**, at 5:30 PM, and runs through **July 9**. The league is sanctioned by NRA for the following rifles:

- <u>Service Rifle</u> basically any rifle used in the service, present or in the past, such as AR, Springfields, Garand It generally is fired using a sling and shooting coat.
- Match Rifle Any rifle designed to shoot at long range. It is also fired using a sling and shooting coat. Any sights, generally scopes.
- <u>F-Class</u> Any rifle using a bipod or rifle rest and rear rest. These rifles are also designed to shoot at long range.
- <u>Tactical AR</u> AR platform rifle with a bipod and rear rest.
- <u>Fullbore Rifle</u> Any rifle designed to shoot at long range. It is also fired using a sling and shooting coat. Iron sights.
- Sporting Rifle Any centerfire hunting rifle (not NRA sanctioned)

The course of fire, known as Reduced Mid-Range, is 2 strings of 20 shots for record at 300 yds from the prone position. The course of fire can be reduced to 2 strings of 10 if you choose. Mid-Range is normally fired at 600 yds, but we use the short course targets that are reduced to simulate the 600 yd target at 300 yds. Scores will be submitted to the NRA for classification. Our electronic targets (ShotMarkers) are used; however, official scoring will be on paper score sheets.

So, <u>all you need is a rifle, ammo, a 300 yard zero and \$8 (to cover range & NRA fees)</u>. This is very good practice to perfect your shooting fundamentals and learn your rifle. There will be several NRA classified shooters shooting, who can help you with the fundamentals.
