#### Rifle Range Safety Issues of Concern - PLEASE READ!

**Hello Members!** I'm writing to discuss some not-so-great developments at our rifle range, and ask for your help!

In 2018, our club completed a \$170,000 upgrade project to the lower range, which included the addition of a 300-yard rifle range, separating the 100-yard and 200/300-yard ranges, enclosing and heating a section of the pistol range, and enclosing and heating part of the rifle range. Since that project's completion, we have experienced episodes of damage to our ranges. It's my sad duty to report to you that our enclosed range has over 50 bullet holes in the building. It is abundantly clear that some of these holes are the result of carelessness, some as a result of intentional unsafe acts, and some are acts of vandalism.

In Spring of 2022, we experienced a bout of vandalism by someone with a shotgun and a 10mm pistol. We believe these acts from 2022 were perpetrated by trespassers. St. Joseph County Sheriff was called in to investigate, and several club neighbors were interviewed. The Sheriff reported to us that they identified a likely "candidate" for the bad actor, but there was not enough evidence to pursue criminal charges.

In Spring/Summer of 2023, the vandalism began again—this time by someone with a small caliber rifle, likely a .17cal or .20 cal. and also, a larger caliber rifle, likely a .350 Legend. Summer 2023 also saw a hole appear in our roof ridge line above the aluminum stairs. It's clear that someone attempted to shoot over the range house at the 300 yard "gong" while using the stairs railing as a shooting rest.

This Spring has been no exception: We have had several of our range house vertical posts shot on the 200/300-yard side, and several overhead door frames shot on the 25-and 50-yard side. Most egregious: In two separate incidents, both of the double-entry-doors on the enclosed 100-yard side have now been shot. The larger caliber hole went inward at a downward angle, but the 22-caliber bullet traveled the entire length of the range house and exited the west wall. **THIS COULD HAVE KILLED SOMEONE!** 

Several of the wooden shooting rests have been used as targets too. And, to add insult to injury, a few weeks ago, someone killed a deer on the 200-yard range. It may be possible the deer ran in front of someone while they were shooting but that seems unlikely as it was a perfect heart-shot. Michigan DNR is investigating this as an act of Poaching. Poaching---at a sportsman's club with a mission of conservation and preserving our natural resources. Unbelievable!

There are several holes in the walls, window frames, ceiling, roll-up door, and floor. All of which were likely UD (Unintentional Discharges)—a result of poor muzzle control combined with poor trigger discipline.

#### What I'm asking of you:

- If you experience an Unintentional Discharge (UD) that caused damage, please contact a board member to tell us about it! We've had a few members do exactly that! They had to review the incident with the Board and repair the damage, but they are still members! You will be treated the same!
- 2. If you witness a UD, Vandalism, or "General Dumbassery", report it! The offender will have a chance to tell their side of the story. In the case of dumbassery, *safety is everyone's duty*!

What does all this mean for us going forward? Well, lots of things. We now have two different Law Enforcement Agencies with a spotlight on our club. We have physical damage to our structures which degrades them for everyone. And, it's very likely the club will have to add a camera system, additional gate monitors, full-time paid range officers, or a combination of the above, which could easily result in <u>increased dues for the entire membership.</u>

Look folks, I know, and the entire Board knows, that the 900+ members we have are responsible, safe, and ethical. Like most things, it's the few who ruin it for the many.
